Description: This is an excellent opportunity for applicants to gain interdisciplinary experiences while working with a unique marine conservation charity. The Berwickshire Marine Reserve (BMR) encompasses 10.3km² of some of the most diverse and stunning marine environment along the Berwickshire coast, supporting a variety of commercial and recreational interests.

The Summer Marine Ranger will be part of the public/visible arm of the BMR. Activities will include raising awareness of the marine environment through education, public events (particularly along the shore), communications campaigns, community engagement and liaison with stakeholders and user groups. As this role will involve working with children and vulnerable adults, a PVG check will be carried out.

Our Marine Ranger interns will be an integral part of the BMR team ensuring delivery on our programme of summer events and supporting our team undertaking a variety of Citizen Science projects to engage our local community in robust data collection.

This post can run concurrently with a volunteer position with St Abbs Marine Station. 2 days working voluntarily at this busy research aquarium and 28 hours on outreach work with BMR, this position would be a fantastic opportunity to gain wide experience in the marine conservation field.
